
One Health Interrelationship - Human, Animal, and Environment


The health of people depends on animals and environment.

Example: When sewage contaminates water, both humans and animals fall sick.



- Persistent Cough or breathing trouble may indicate Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (e.g., COVID-19, Influenza)
- Fever with changed mental status (e.g., confusion) with or without seizure may indicate Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (e.g., Japanese Encephalitis)
- Fever and body pain may indicate Acute Febrile Illness (e.g., Dengue, Typhoid)
- Diarrhea may indicate Acute Diarrheal disorders (e.g., Cholera, Typhoid)





Modes of Transmission

Examples:

Air: COVID-19 | prevention: Masks

Water: Typhoid | prevention: drink boiled water

Food: E coli food Poisoning | prevention: Avoid

unhygienic foods

Soil: Tetanus | prevention: TT inj after a wound



Rabies – Dogs, Bats

Influenza – Birds, Pigs

Malaria – Mosquito

Leptospirosis - Rats

Nipah – Bats, Pigs
